## Eliezer - My God is My Succor

<sup>2</sup>But Abram said, "My Lord Adonai, what will You give me, since I am living without children, and the heir of my household is Eliezer of Damascus?" <sup>3</sup>Then Abram said, "Look! You have given me no seed, so a house-born servant is my heir." <sup>4</sup>Then behold, the word of Adonai came to him saying, "This one will not be your heir, but in fact, one who will come from your own body will be your heir." (Gen. 15:2-4) Then Abraham said to his servant, the oldest of his household who managed everything that belonged to him, 'Now put your hand under my thigh, <sup>3</sup>so that I may make you take an oath by Adonai, the God of heaven and the God of earth, that you will not take a wife for my son from among the daughters of the Canaanites among whom I am dwelling. <sup>4</sup>On the contrary, to my land and to my relatives you must go and get a wife for my son Isaac'"(Gen. 24:2-4)

Eliezer is a Hebrew name which means "My God is my succor." Succor is not a common English word (it is common in Spanish, socorro) and it means 'To give assistance/help in time of want, difficulty, or distress.' Abraham entrusts a gentile – the most trusted servant and heir in his household – to bring The Almighty's succor to the current situation. Eliezer was a servant/steward but had considerable responsibility as the number one person in the household. Eliezer was a gentile! How important is this gentile in The Almighty's plan? Very, in fact critical. What a beautiful Torah picture of the exalted place gentiles will have in Yah Adonai's Plan throughout the ages! Abraham's household is also a Torah picture of the Messianic Age consisting for both Jews and Gentiles together in the Household of Faith. Eliezer is the first Messianic Gentile mentioned in Scripture from the very beginning, faithfully serving Abraham our Father and being worthy of Abraham's inheritance! Eliezer was among the first males to ever be circumcised with Abraham and Ishmael: <sup>26</sup>"On this very same day Abraham and Ishmael his son were circumcised. <sup>27</sup>Also all the men of his house, house-born slaves and slaves purchased from a foreigner, were circumcised with him" (Gen. 17:26-27). Eliezer was included in the original B'rit Milah in history.

Who can find a virtuous woman? ("10A capable, intelligent, and [a]virtuous woman—who is he who can find her? She is far more precious than jewels and her value is far above rubies or pearls." Prov. 31:10, AMP) Eliezer shared Abraham's complete trust in everything, including Yah Adonai — they both served the same Elohim! In prayer, he devises a series of confirmations in which he could not only be guided by Yah Adonai but also observe the potential bride's virtue and character. Ultimately, it is her virtue (her character) that accomplishes the task at hand. What did Eliezer observe in Rebekah?

He observed at least seven character qualities in her, mainly, hospitality, cooperative, industrious, considerate, inner beauty, chastity, and obedience to The Almighty. In my November 23, 2019 message entitled Eliezer Finds a Virtuous Wife for Isaac I expounded on each of these character qualities as described in the text. (1) Rebekah knew how to treat strangers and visitors. (2) She was cooperative, and not disagreeable. (3) She was a hard worker. (4) She was sensitive to others' needs and considerate – of both animals and people (she had a kind heart). (5) She possessed physical beauty and goodness in her heart. (6) The text makes it clear that she was a virgin (betulah) "whom no man had known." Finally, (7) she was willing to follow Eliezer to Abraham's home to marry Isaac after discerning this was Yah's will.

Prayer is and was the *Secret of Finding God's Choice for a Life Partner*. Not only did Abraham pray about his son's future wife but *Eliezer* prayed. Even as he was praying the answer was *simultaneously* happening, for out came *Rebekah* to draw water. This is something that *Yah* does frequently when we pray: "*Before they call I will answer; while they are still speaking I will hear"* (*Is.* 65:24). Both *Eliezer* and Abraham knew the *secret of finding a life partner*. They *both* fervently prayed and sought *The Almighty's* guidance. *Rebekah* proved to be just the right wife for him. *Shabbat Shalom!*
